
Nancy North and her Curriculum committee have put together a wonderful group of classes for the Fall term. They all sound interesting! It was hard to decide which classes to take.

The Daughters of Yalta:
The Churchills, Roosevelts and Harrimans:
A Story of Love and War
by Catherine Grace Katz

The story of the "daughter diplomacy" of Anna Roosevelt, Sarah Churchill, and Kathleen Harriman, three glamorous young women who accompanied their famous fathers to the Yalta Conference with Stalin in the waning days of World War II. Tensions during the Yalta Conference in February 1945 threatened to tear apart the wartime alliance among Franklin Roosevelt, Winston Churchill, and Joseph Stalin just as victory was close at hand. Katz uncovers the dramatic story of the three young women who were chosen by their fathers to travel with them to Yalta. Anna Roosevelt, Sarah Churchill and Kathleen Harriman were each bound by fierce family loyalty, political savvy, and intertwined romances that powerfully colored these crucial days. Situated in the political maelstrom that marked the transition to a post-war world, their relationships were tested and strengthened by the history they witnessed and the future they crafted together.



A Renaissance Person to Know - Sr. Jean McGrath, CSJ

I joined the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph as an altruistic child of the 1960s, believing that as a member of a religious community, I could best answer the challenge of JFK to "ask not what your country can do for you, but what you can do for your country." As in other congregations at the time, our novitiate had over sixty young women in formation when I entered, three months after graduating from McAuley. Although numbers are quite different now, it is good to

appreciate and celebrate the many leadership roles women have assumed in the Church.

I received my degree from Rosary College (now Dominican University) with a major in English. Being the second oldest of seven children and having vast babysitting experience in the St. Cajetan community where I grew up, I looked forward to teaching little children and was delighted when my first assignment was to teach second grade. Quite frankly, although I loved the work, my classroom management skills with mini scholars left much to be desired.

My next assignment was to teach English and Theology at St. Paul High School in the Garfield Ridge area. The school was a unique educational experiment designed by the Archdiocese and the Chicago Public Schools. Students spent half of their day at St. Paul, where they took English, Social Studies, and Religion Classes, and the balance of their day at Kennedy High School, two blocks away. Unfortunately, for a variety of reasons, the school closed. While at St. Paul, I completed my Master's in school administration and was asked to become the principal at St. Hugh School in Lyons, IL. After eight years at St. Hugh, the outgoing principal at St. John Fisher asked if I would consider applying to be the new principal at St. John Fisher. What I thought would be a three-year commitment ended thirty years later when I retired.

Renaissance classes have been a wonderful asset to some of my retirement hours. I enjoy the classroom conversations and the camaraderie of fellow "students." Other retirement time is spent on committee work with the Sisters of St. Joseph, volunteer projects, reading, long lunches and dinners with friends, and enjoying my siblings and their fast-growing families, most of whom, as we tease, never moved out of the 60655 zip code.

The altruism of the sixties did not result in heroic work in foreign lands. Rather, my missionary zeal and life's journey to date led me across 103rd Street from St. Cajetan,

where the seed was planted, to St. John Fisher. I continue to strongly believe that a vibrant parish and school community is where most of us experience what it means to be "Church." Church as a community of faith where we come together to strengthen our love for God, strive to provide the best for our families and others, seek peace and justice for those most in need, and walk with each other in good times and not so good times. During these turbulent times, I guess that is what JFK and Jesus would want.


