RENAISSANCE FORUM Women in History


Tuesday, March 11, 2025, 11:30 a.m., Butler Room Presented by **Martina Mathisen**

This is one of the best books I have ever read and I was not familiar with *The Little House* books!

The Little House books, for all the hardships they describe, are paeans to the pioneer spirit, portraying it as triumphant against

all odds. But Laura Ingalls Wilder's real life was harder and grittier than that: a story of relentless struggle, rootlessness, and poverty. It was only in her sixties, after losing nearly everything in the Great Depression, that she turned to children's books, recasting her hardscrabble childhood as a celebratory vision of homesteading—and achieving fame and fortune in the process—in one of the most astonishing rags-to-riches episodes in American letters.

Spanning nearly a century of epochal change, from the Indian Wars to the Dust Bowl, Wilder's dramatic life provides a unique perspective on American history and our national mythology of self-reliance. With fresh insights and discoveries, *Prairie Fires* reveals the complex woman whose classic stories grip us to this day.

A Renaissance Person You Should Know Bobbie Murray

Bobbie Murray, a woman of many interests and talents, complements our Renaissance family. The eldest of four, Bobbie was born on the Southwest Side and attended St. Denis Grammar School and Bogan High School. Her parents encouraged her to become a nurse, and Bobbie was interested in that career. However, she abandoned that idea after a disastrous attempt to journey to the North Side via the mysterious world of public transportation. A few months later, having

mastered the art of commuting by bus, Bobbie accepted a position with a manufacturing company and rose to become the secretary to the Nationwide Director of Advertising. After a sabbatical to raise her sons, Bobbie returned to office work for 20 years concentrating on real estate and multiple areas of law. She retired in 2009.

Bobbie met her husband Bill in Jacksonville, Florida, at a christening. Bill worked with the baby's Father when both men were serving in the Navy. Bill and Bobbie married one year later and lived in Jacksonville for three months until his discharge. They then lived in Bill's hometown, Schuylkill Haven, Pennsylvania for a year and a half. After retirement, both Bobbie and Bill served the Evergreen Park American Legion. In 2015, Bobbie became a volunteer with Honor Flight Chicago where she now devotes most of her time and expertise. She has had the privilege of assisting and sending over 11,000 veterans (since its inception in 2008) for their well-deserved day of honor in Washington, D.C., visiting the memorials in their honor.

Her hobbies include sewing, needlework, embroidery, cross-stitching, knitting, crocheting, and other crafts. An avid traveler, Bobbie has explored much of the United States, has visited Canada, and toured most of Europe. She would love to get to Australia and New Zealand someday.
